All of us have sinned and fallen short, and we deserve death. Thankfully, Jesus - who lived a life without sin - took upon Himself all of our sins on the cross, freeing us from the burden of sin. 12 "What shall I do, then, with the one you call the king of the Jews?" Pilate asked them. 13 "Crucify him!" they shouted. 14 "Why? What crime has he committed?" asked Pilate. But they shouted all the louder, "Crucify him!" 15 Wanting to satisfy the crowd, Pilate released Barabbas to them. He had Jesus flogged, and handed him over to be crucified.

16 The soldiers led Jesus away into the palace (that is, the Praetorium) and called together the whole company of soldiers. 17 They put a purple robe on him, then twisted together a crown of thorns and set it on him. 18 And they began to call out to him, "Hail," king of the Jews!" 19 Again and again they struck him on the head with a staff and spit on him. Falling on their knees, they paid homage to him. 20 And when they had mocked him, they took off the purple robe and put his own clothes on him. Then they led him out to crucify him.

21 A certain man from Cyrene, Simon, the father of Alexander and Rufus, was passing by on his way in from the country, and they forced him to carry the cross. 22 They brought Jesus to the place called Golgotha (which means "the place of the skull"). 23 Then they offered him wine mixed with myrrh, but he did not take it. 24 And they crucified him. Dividing up his clothes, they cast lots to see what each would get. 25 It was nine in the morning when they crucified him. 26 The written notice of the charge against him read: the king of the jews.

27 They crucified two rebels with him, one on his right and one on his left. (28 So the Scripture was fulfilled which says, "And He was numbered with the transgressors.") 29 Those who passed by hurled insults at him, shaking their heads and saying, "So! You who are going to destroy the temple and build it in three days, 30 come down from the cross and save yourself!" 31 In the same way the chief priests and the teachers of the law mocked him among themselves. "He saved others," they said, "but he can't save himself! 32 Let this Messiah, this king of Israel, come down now from the cross, that we may see and believe." Those crucified with him also heaped insults on him.

Summary - Special Cards

UNO is a classic game due to its simplicity and accessibility, yet it can also become surprisingly intense. We plan to harness this unique intensity by organizing an UNO tournament that is so serious, it's almost comical. The vision for this event is to host multiple games simultaneously, where both 'nerdy' and athletic students can come together and build connections with one another.

Enhancement Ideas

Take your funniest youth leaders, dress them in referee outfits with whistles, and have them commit to officiating games of UNO - instant classic. As for rewards, I would make them humorous as well, ensuring that students aren't discouraged after a loss since they're not playing for money or equivalent prizes. There's a large, fake gold chain online that says 'Champion' - it would be hilarious if the winner received it, got their picture taken wearing it, and had that photo displayed in the youth room or the lead pastor's office. Perfect bragging rights!

Behavior Management

At the start of the event, before any games begin, it would be wise to review the expectations for the evening. This should include guidelines on how to show respect to others and demonstrate good sportsmanship. It's also crucial to go over the tournament rules, as confusion often leads to frustration. Since UNO rules can vary depending on each player's household, it's important to clarify the specific rules for this tournament.



Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" 27 Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe." 28 Thomas said to him, "My Lord and my God!"

29 Then Jesus told him, "Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

30 Jesus performed many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not recorded in this book. 31 But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.
